

Why is this important?

Evidence on the health system impacts of digital testing services that justifies their continued scale-up is lacking.

What did we do?

GetCheckedOnline (GCO) is a free digital testing service for HIV, Hepatitis C, Chlamydia and Gonorrhea and


We conducted an online survey among 789 regular users of GetCheckedOnline testing between April-October 2022. We asked participants about their patterns of testing online and through providers, and access to providers for testing.

Most common reasons for testing through providers:

- Seeing provider for other reason,
- Wanting to talk about sexual health,
- Having symptoms,
- Needing routine testing for HIV care/PrEP,
- Needing test not offered,
